Ron Roland: A Love Affair with Nature & Color!

One look at Ron Roland's art and it becomes obvious that he likes trees and color - perfectly shaped trees and beautiful, rich color. Roland has been named the featured artist for the fall edition of Richardson's Cottonwood Art Festival, to be held Oct. 5-6, 2013, in Richardson's Cottonwood Park. A park full of trees is an apt setting to display his work.

"I was tickled - totally shocked when I found out. I have really good customers at Cottonwood," Roland says. "I can't wait. I have a whole bunch of new stuff, a new body of work. I'm calling it Flower Series - it's a blending of the old with the new."

The Florida artist describes his work as contemporary landscapes in acrylic impasto style on birch panels, noting that he has a "love affair with color and movement...I want my paintings to evoke participation. I want the viewer to be plunged into the scene by the simple act of viewing."

Dublin Drive & Dover Drive Improvements

- The October Cottonwood Art Festival Artist “load in” & “load out” is planned to accommodate 210 artists and work within the available conditions of the Dublin/Dover Drive bond improvements project.
- The Richardson High School Homecoming Parade, Friday from 3 to 5 PM, in close proximity to the Cottonwood Art Festival complicates matters for the artists load in, however solutions have been found.
- The Parks and Recreation Department, Police Department, Traffic Department and Capital Projects staff have collaborated on a safe transportation and pedestrian plan for artists load in, load out, and general public safety for ingress and egress throughout the weekend.

Schedule of Projects in Next Four Months:



1. Northbound Dublin Drive, from Colfax Drive to Belt Line Road, will be closed and traffic will be one-way southbound beginning the week of Sept. 23 through January 2014 for paving and water line improvements
2. Construction of right turn lane on Dublin Drive at Belt Line Road and signal work will take place from September through January 2014
3. Dumont Drive, from Dublin Drive to Cottonwood Drive, will be closed through December for culvert replacement and bridge railing aesthetics at the Dumont and Hunt Branch culvert

Schedule of Projects Beginning in 2014:

4. Southbound Dover Drive, from Belt Line Road to Colfax Drive, will be closed and traffic will be one-way northbound beginning early 2014 for paving, drainage and water line improvements
5. Northbound Dover Drive, from Belt Line Road to Colfax Drive, will be closed and traffic will be one-way southbound beginning in spring 2014 for paving, drainage and waterline improvements
6. Dumont Drive, from Dover Drive to just east of Water-view Drive, will have some alternating lane closures from late 2013 to early 2014 for drainage and pavement repairs



- Footwashers Ministries in an umbrella organization connecting churches and other groups with those in need.




ABOUT PETER BURKS


